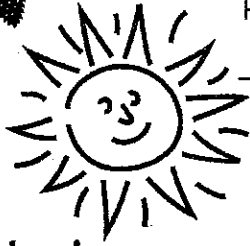

**What can you do in your family to celebrate Pentecost?**

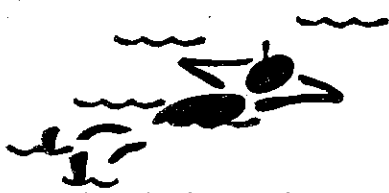
Read together Acts 2:1-40.

So ashamed of my life, my life, my life

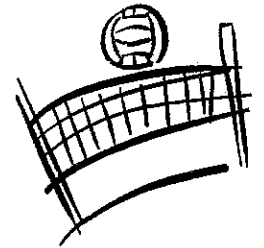

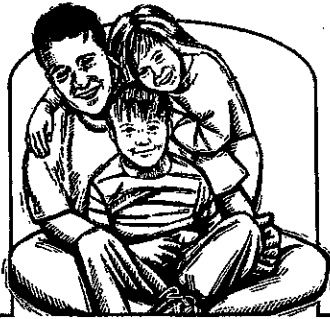
